### Mid-morning break for Year 3 and Year 4

As many of you will be aware children from nursery up to year two receive free fruit from the government and this is usually given to the children m id morning or mid-afternoon. In addition parents are asked to kindly donate one packet of biscuits per half term for the second snack of the day.

Children in year 3 and year 4 are encouraged to bring to school a piece of fresh fruit for morning break if they would like to. E.g. apple, banana, Satsuma, pot of grapes / pineapple / melon, pear. Please do not send any kind of packaged dried fruit or fruit snacks or breakfast bars.

It is vital that all children read for 5-10 minutes every day with you and that you sign their reading record book so that we can see they have been practising. Please support us and your children with this very important part of their learning.
