School Uniform

Please support your child with adhering to our school uniform policy. We have recently noticed a growing number of diversions particularly footwear and accessories.

Seaton Sluice First School uniform consists of:

- White shirt/blouse or polo shirt
- Purple sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- Grey or black school trousers or skirt/pinafore
- Grey or white socks or tights
- Black shoes or boots (please see below)
- Check or striped summer dresses
- Hairstyles should be appropriate and colour of hair should look natural

Accessories should be plain, low key and in school colours or black (e.g. hair slides, head bands)

Footwear

Children should wear 'sensible flat school shoes' with laces, buckles or Velcro fastenings to ensure safety at all times. The school wants all children's' feet to grow healthily. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels and we strongly discourage the wearing of such. Neither do we allow children to wear trainers to school. This is because this type of footwear is damaging, in the long term, to growing feet and is only appropriate for sports, PE or leisurewear. Neither is it in keeping with the smart appearance of a school uniform.

<u>Attendance</u>

Attendance is a high priority for the school. The Seaton Valley Partnership of Schools (8 schools altogether) has agreed that parents/carers will be informed by letter when their child's attendance drops below 96%. A further letter will be sent if attendance drops below 92% and will trigger advice being sought from the EWO (Education Welfare Officer) and no further absence will be authorised without proof of a medical reason. When absence falls below 90% a referral to the EWO will be made.

Please be aware and understand that the letters are worded formally and are not intended to offend, scare or annoy parents/carers.

We are as a school sympathetic to individual family's needs and circumstances and open dialogue between school and parents/carers is always our preferred option in order to reach solutions. Please contact the school and make an appointment to see Mrs Love should you wish to discuss your personal situation in more detail.

<u>Art lessons</u>

We would like to ensure children's uniform is protected during art lessons and when messier activities are taking place. Please send in an old shirt with the sleeves cut off half way or even better and old adult sized t shirt that can be worn over the top of uniform.

Year one pupils

Our year one pupils line up in the yard and come into school with their teacher/TA once the bell has gone at 8.55am. Please encourage your children to be independent and let them come into school alone. They are all very capable of managing their own coats, book bags, water bottles etc...
