Running a mile a day!

Purple Class have enjoyed taking part in a trial week before the Easter holidays involving them running or quick walking a mile each day. This was a great success and many parents have commented on what a good idea they think this is. At Seaton Sluice, we recognise our role in promoting a healthy, active lifestyle and think that this would be an excellent idea to trial across the whole school now. Staff will lead by example and also join in this fitness programme with the children. Staffs have agreed to aim for at least three occasions across a school week where the children will run or walk the following distances. If any parents or carers would be interested in joining us running weekly mile together, please let Mrs Bennett know. If we receive a good amount of interest, this is something that we could look into organising.

Reception, Years 1 and 2: Children will try to complete at least $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile

Years 3 and 4: Children will try to complete at least 1 mile.

Children <u>will not</u> be expected to wear full PE kit but will wear suitable footwear. They are welcome to bring in a pair of named trainers to keep in school but this is not essential.

The Tall Ships Opening Ceremony
