# <u>Minute Maths</u>

Starting from next half term the fabulous mathematicians of Seaton Sluice First School will enjoy challenging themselves as they apply their mathematical knowledge and understanding to complete a weekly 'Minute Maths test.' The tests cover all strands of the Numeracy Strategy and offer practise in speed of recall, basic computational skills and maths fluency. Children will be rewarded for their success by travelling up a 'Maths Mountain' which will be displayed in the school hall. Throughout the year children will progress and receive bronze, silver and gold award certificates during Friday assemblies.

# <u>30 things to do before you're 3 challenge</u>

For all children, the greatest outcomes in terms of intellectual and social development come when they have access to quality learning experiences in the home. Parents are the first and most important influence on their child's development and future outcomes, more so than innate ability, material circumstances or the quality of early years provision.

To support parents in the types of experiences they have with their children and to promote quality interactions in the home, the Northumberland Early Years Team have designed a '30 things to do before you're 3' challenge. Based upon the research of how young children learn, the team has chosen 30 activities which we feel all children should have experience of before the age of three years. These experiences are free, accessible by all and most importantly fun with a focus on improving children's skills in all areas of learning, particularly the prime areas.
