### Target Memories




Freezing is when a liquid, like water, gets very cold and turns into a solid, like ice.

Melting is when something solid, like ice, gets warm and turns into a liquid, like water.




Some special animals live in the polar regions.

Kenya is a hot country in Africa.




People eat different foods depending on where they live.

Animals like elephants, giraffes, zebras, lions and monkeys live in grasslands, called the Savannah.




Some Kenyan people wear bright, colourful clothes with beautiful patterns.
