<u>English</u>

We will continue to look at descriptive writing but focussing on characters rather than story settings. Using Roald Dahl's 'The BFG', we will begin to write in role of a variety of characters and study the importance of tense and 1st person when writing this way. Towards the end of our fiction novel, we will begin to look at instructional writing. We will then look at writing our own recipes and instructions linked to our topic book.

Geography

This term we will be finishing off our climates topic, exploring the differences between those we have covered and beginning to think about why they are different based on their geographical location. We will finish the topic looking at our own climate and locality, thinking about what makes 'Seaton Sluice' and what our locality means to us. Through field work, we will explore what our locality looks like on a map.

<u>P.E</u>

Mr Dowson will continue to focus on fundamental skills and multi-skill games with children on Mondays. On Fridays, NUFC will be practicing skills with the children to aid invasion games.

<u>Science</u>

This half term we will focus on animals, including humans and in particular, the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and we will classify animals this way. We will explore what it means to have a healthy lifestyle and how we can help ourselves by looking at the labels on food packaging. Lastly, we will look at the human skeleton, naming bones and understanding our muscles.

<u>Art/D.T</u>

Mrs Dale will complete our work on botanical artists as we develop our shading skills before we move onto some Stone Age art.

<u>PSHE</u>

This half term we will look at bullying and how cyberbullying can take place online. We will discuss the impacts of bullying and how we can look out for and stop it.

<u>History</u>

Mrs Walsh will continue our Bronze, Stone and Iron Age topic using our school visit to The Hancock Museum to help our learning. We will make our own Bronze Age tools and look at how their inventions led to their survival and ways of life.

Computing

With Mrs Walsh, pupils will look at stop frame animations and how we can include animations in a variety of computer programmes, such as Microsoft PowerPoint.

<u>MFL</u>

Children will revisit French greetings and begin to look at some basic conversational vocabulary.

Mathematics

Children will complete a new unit of learning this half term, addition and subtraction, using their knowledge from place value to support our learning. Children will use manipulatives and mathematic models to encourage pattern spotting within addition and subtraction of 100s, 10s and 1s.
