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

Our current whole school average is 93% which is below our school target of 96.2%. Whilst there are some genuine cases of illness, we also have some families booking holidays during term time. Please remember that these holidays will not be authorised. This is agreed across the Seaton Valley partnership. Blocks of time away from school can impact on academic progress and your child not feeling as settled and happy on return to school. We want all of our pupils to have the very best opportunities so they can thrive and achieve the best outcomes during their time with us at school. Well done to Year 2 for achieving 93.9% this week.

End of term gifts policy

In response to the cost of living for many families, staff and governors have agreed that we should no longer accept end of term gifts. We very much feel privileged to be in our roles as staff at Seaton Sluice First School and believe that we should not be rewarded for carrying out our responsibilities; we love our jobs and love the families who we work with. Staff have also been asked not to buy end of term gifts for their classes and instead, plan in some special end of term activities.

Whilst families may feel that they would like to show their appreciation, we respectfully request that gifts are no longer bought or given to staff. This will hopefully relieve pressure, with families at times wondering which staff to buy for and also feel worried about finances. We would far prefer money to be spent on school trips to allow us to take the children out of school on occasions. There will also be opportunities at school performances to contribute through collections towards the school fund account which uses money to purchase resources for the benefit of all pupils. We want to assist families in whichever ways we can-minimising additional potential stress.





















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Reminder: Start of the school day and Breakfast Club

Please remember that the school day begins for all pupils at 8:45am and finishes at the same time, 3:15pm (with the exception of Nursery). If you have more than one child attending our school, we recommend that children from Reception to Year 4 should be safely dropped first to their class line in the yard. Any siblings attending Nursery can be dropped off after this. Please remember that everyone should be ready to line up for 8:45am. If you arrive slightly late and your child misses lining up, please continue to make your way to the usual door for their year group. There are a lot of children being dropped to the main entrance, which should only be used if they arrive after 9am.

If you require the service of Breakfast Club, please remember that this is a pay on the day arrangement. Should you wish to pay in advance, this can be arranged with Mrs Dale making a note of the payment. If your child uses wraparound as well as breakfast club, both services can be combined on the same invoice-this should be arranged via the school office with Mrs Howes, our Finance Manager.
