
## Nursery Topic Web-Autumn 2: Celebrations




What festivals do you and your family celebrate at home?

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development: We will be learning to:

- · Welcome our new friends into nursery and help them with our daily routines.
- New children will learn to leave their grown ups

- Continue to follow our class routines and follow our vis timetable
- Use our 'Choose it. Use it. Put it away' mantra to help us respect our things and to keep our classroom tidy
- Continue to line up and sing our lining up song
- Learn to share equipment with friends and take turns during activities
- Learn to use our words to help us with
- sharing and turn taking.



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## Mathematics:

- Sort by colour, shape and size
- Continue to use our self-registration board to learn about 5 frames. 'What do you notice?' What do you see?'
- Subitising up to 3
- Say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5
- Sing counting songs and rhymes
- Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total
- Show 'finger numbers' up to 5
- Extend and create ABAB patterns
- Notice and correct an error in a repeating pattern

# Expressive Arts and Design:

- Draw a picture of my family
- Experience using different media
- Sing nursery rhymes and songs
- Begin to make believe by pretending through a variety of small world play and the home corner
- Make firework pictures
- Make a Diva lamp for Diwali
- Learn and perform some Christmas songs on stage for our Nativity.

# **Physical Development:** Gross Motor Skills:

## We will be learning to:

- Use the toilet and wash hands independently.
- Put on our own coat and hang it on our own peg
- Put on our own shoes and wellies
- Wipe our own noses. Put tissues in the bin and wash our hands.
- Use the climbing frame and the large construction blocks outside.
- Fit Friday activities-music and movement activities, P.E and yoga

Please help your child by ensuring they have NO LACES or BUCKLES on their shoes.

## Fine Motor Skills:

We will be taking part in a variety of activities designed to develop the muscles in our hands, fingers and thumbs. These include:

- Dough Disco-Exercises to strengthen finger muscles
- Mark making in different mediums: gloop, cornflour, mud,
- glitter
- Cutting activities holding scissors correctly and using them to snip
- Finger Gym activities

### Literacy: Reading & Writing:

Introduce Little Wandle 'Foundations for Phonics:'

Daily activities focussing on tuning into sounds, oral blending, Phase 1 Rhyme Time activities and Foundations for a Love of Reading

Please share a book with your child every day to develop a love of reading.






- Recognise the 'special letter' from your name and begin to recognise your name
- Enjoy mark making freely
- Explore using a variety of mark making equipment e.g pens, chalks, crayons, paints salt, glitter, brushes and water
- Take part in Squiggle Wiggle to practise the up and downside to side, crossover and circle movements
