At Seaton Sluice, we promote a **positive culture** where everyone is encouraged to behave in a **polite**, **considerate and respectful way**. In assembly this week, we talked about our school agreement which includes:

- ❖ Using polite greetings such as saying "good morning", "please" and "thank you".
- ❖ Not interrupting conversations and if urgent, saying "excuse me" and "thank you".
- ❖ Showing mutual respect and being thoughtful towards each other. For example, holding doors open, offering help and checking that people are ok.
- Before entering a room that is being used, knocking and waiting patiently for a "Come in" response.
- * Keeping ourselves safe by remembering to walk around school and not run.





A few reminders



Packed lunches and snacks: We respectfully ask that contents of packed lunches are nutritious with no chocolate bars or fizzy drinks. We understand that many children have limited foods that they enjoy eating. If they see their friends trying different foods, they may show interest in trying new choices. This includes hot meal choices at school. We will not allow children to share any food brought in from home due to allergy risks. Please remember that we also are a nut free school and strictly adhere to this in providing reassurance for families with children who have food allergies. For this reason, cereal bars containing nut pieces or Nutella type spreads are not allowed. Pupils in Reception, Years 1 and 2 will receive a fruit item at morning break. Pupils in Years 3 and 4 are able to bring in a snack that is either fruit, crackers or a plain biscuit. Thank you for your cooperation.

Suitable clothing: Now that the weather is getting colder, please ensure your child brings a coat into school with them. Ideally, a coat with a hood is perfect for changeable weather days. All children are expected to have time outdoors in the fresh air, with the opportunity to run off some energy. School shoes should be comfortable, flat and easy to get on and off.

Wraparound payments: Can we please request that breakfast club is paid for either on the day or in advance (in cash). We appreciate that many people use debit cards as a preferred choice and will explore future options. For families who use breakfast club as well as after school club, Mrs Howes can generate a monthly invoice with the breakfast club fees added onto the wraparound total. For these invoices, payment can also be made through the Tax-Free Childcare scheme or by setting up a payment item on ParentMail.
