






WHAT WILL MY CHILD **BE DOING?**



Attendance and punctuality is extremely important.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD EAT AND DRINK?



Children receive milk for free until the term they turn 5. If your child has a birthday between September and December and you wish them to have milk please complete the form in your pack .

Children also receive a piece of fresh fruit daily.

Filled water bottles should be brought to school dailyplease make sure your child's name is clearly visible .

WHAT WILL MY CHILD EAT AND DRINK?



All children in reception are entitled to a free school dinner. These meals are provided by Dolce.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD WEAR?

 School uniform: Jumper/Cardigan - Purple with or without school emblem Polo shirt - White Skirt/Pinafore (Grey)

Trousers (Grey or black)

Summer dress Purple checks or stripes



• PE kit:

Black or navy shorts and house coloured t-shirt (Fire/Water/Air/Earth)

You will receive an email with the house your child has been put into.





WHAT WILL MY CHILD WEAR?

- All belongings including uniform, PE kits and PE bags need to be clearly labelled with names please!
- Drawstring PE bags please. We do not have space for large backpacks.
- Children must have a purple bookbag.
- Keyrings
- Please put spare clothes in PE bags
- We spend a lot of time learning outdoors, ensure your child has a waterproof coat.
- Wellies to leave in school



MEDICAL MATTERS

- Any sickness, diarrhoea, must be followed by 48 hours absence.
- Any absence requires a note or telephone call explaining why.
- Prescribed medicines can be administered by staff, but parents will have to fill in a signed permission slip at the school office. (Please do not put any medication into your child's bookbag or drink)
- Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- If your child is poorly, please do keep them at home so they can rest and recover properly.





HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Please buy clothes, shoes and coats that are easy to put on (No jump suit style dresses, laces or buckles on shoes please)
- Please ensure your child has a school book bag, clearly labelled. No big rucksacks or bags as we don't have the space.
- If your child is particularly anxious on their first day, don't worry this is normal.
 Leaving them is the best thing you can do. You can call the office to see how they are getting on.
- Routines at home are important.
- Promoting independence at home is important
- Talk to your child, read and sing with them as much as possible.
