Talk about what activities you like to do at school.


How do you feel about coming to school?

Timothy Pope likes to go to the park. What do you like to do out of school?



Sing a range of Nursery Rhymes at home.








 Use mirrors to help talk about what you look like. Look at skin, eye and hair colour/length/texture.

- Learn to how to play with others, share equipment with friends and take turns during activities.


Mathematics:

Vocabulary: Full, empty, more,


Learn subitising skills

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Learn how to use paint brushes, put the brushes back into the correct pots, put pictures onto the drying rack and clean our hands and workspaces
- Paint a picture of themselves
- Experience using different media
- Sing nursery rhumes and songs
- Begin to make believe by pretending through a variety of small world play and the home corner



Let your child have plenty of opportunities to get creative at home with chalks, paints, pens and collage. This will help their fine motor skills.

Physical Development:

Gross Motor Skills:

We will be learning to:

- · Use the toilet and wash hands independently.
- · Put on our own coat and hang it on our peg
- Put on own apron
- · Wipe and blow our own noses. Put our tissues in the bin
- and wash and dry our hands







Please help your child at home by encouraging them to dress themselves, put on their own coats and shoes.

Fine Motor Skills:

We will be taking part in a variety of activities designed to develop the muscles in our hands, fingers and thumbs. These include:

- Daily Dough Disco
- · Cutting activities holding scissors correctly and using them to snip
- Finger Gym activities such as threading and mark making

· We will work on the up, down and side to side move

Literacy: Reading and Writing:

- Listen to and join in with chosen stories, rhymes, and songs from our special story suitcase. These will be read several times so that the children become familiar with them and can join in.
- There will be a big focus on learning new vocabulary. Adults will model any new vocabulary within the provision and encourage the children to use it themselves.
- Children will notice how their name looks and find the initial letter themselves.
- Children will always have mark making opportunities around nursery. This includes using a variety of mark making equipment such as pens, chalks, crayons, paints salt, glitter,
- brushes and water
- The children will begin 'Squiggle whilst you Wiggle' and focus on the 'Up and down' and 'side to side' movement
- The children will start Little Wandle-Foundations for Phonics





Please share your favourite books at home with your child so that they develop a love for books and listening to stories.

Communication and Language:

- Learn the names of my teachers, my new friends and my class name.
- Talk about what I like
- Talk about myself and my family
- Develop listening and language skills through our topic related stories
- Learn a range songs and rhymes including our 'Hello' song.
