





WHAT WILL HAPPENSAT **THE START OF THE DAY?**

Please don't bring them in unless asked to do so by a member of staff. Children may cry initially, this soon stops!

Any queries/problems, please see a member of staff before/after school. (After school is better if a longer conversation is needed)

Once the Early Years gate opens, the children will enter through the reception classroom door.

OTHER USEFUl INFORMATION

- Letters and key information from the school office will be sent out to you via Parent Mail so please do ensure you check your emails regularly.
- We will also add a curriculum web to our section of the website every half term, telling you the key books and topics your child will be covering in the coming weeks.
- You will be invited to join a platform called Class Dojo. This will be used to share our learning each week and for you to upload anything special from home.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD EAT AND DRINK?



Children receive milk for free until the term they turn 5. If your child has a birthday between September and December and you wish them to have milk please complete the form in your pack .

Children also receive a piece of fresh fruit daily.

Water bottles should be brought to school daily- please make sure your child's name is clearly visible .

Please let us know if your child has any allergies.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD EAT AND DRINK?



All children in reception are entitled to a free school dinner. These meals are provided by Dolce.

Please be aware that school will still receive a substantial amount of top up funding for children eligible for free school meals, looked after children, adopted children and forces children. If your child fall into any of these categories please let me know.

If you would prefer your child to have a packed lunch. Please clearly label it with your child's name. It should not include any chocolate, sweets or fizzy drinks





WHAT WILL MY CHILD WEAR?

• School uniform: Jumper/Cardigan - Purple with or without school emblem Polo shirt - White Skirt/Pinafore (Grey) Trousers (Grey or black) Summer dress Purple checks or stripes

• PE kit:



Black or navy shorts and house coloured t-shirt (Fire/Water/Air/Earth)

You will receive an email with the house your child has been put into.





WHAT WILL MY CHILD WEAR?

- All belongings including uniform, PE kits and PE bags need to be clearly labelled with names please!
- Drawstring PE bags please
- Spare clothes in PE bags
- We spend a lot of time learning outdoors, ensure your child has a waterproof coat.
- Wellies to leave in school



MEDICAL MATTERS

- Any sickness, diarrhoea, must be followed by 48 hours absence.
- Any absence requires a note or telephone call explaining why.
- Prescribed medicines can be administered by staff, but parents will have to fill in a signed permission slip.
- Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.







HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Buy clothes, shoes and coats that are easy to put on (No jump suit style dresses, laces or buckles on shoes please)
- Please ensure your child has a school book bag, clearly labelled. No big rucksacks or bags as we don't have the space.
- If your child is particularly anxious on their first day, don't worry this is normal. Leaving them is the best thing you can do. You can call the
- office to see how they are getting on.
