








Respond to 'who', 'where' 'what' and 'when' questions linked to text and illustrations Sequence two events from a familiar story

#### Reading-

Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.

Blend sounds into words Read a few tricky words matched to the Little Wandle phonic programme

#### Writing-

Makes make marks and drawings using increasing control Use some recognisable letters and own symbols.

Write letters and strings, sometimes in clusters like words.

Understands that thoughts and stories can be written down.

> Orally spell VC and CVC words by identifying the sounds.

> > Write own name.

Form letters from their name correctly. Recognise that after a word there is a space.
